Admission requirements

Museum Studies can be studied by any student presently enrolled and registered at the University of Oulu, but in cases when student numbers are limited, students in the History, Cultural Anthropology and Archaeology programmes are given priority. Museum Studies can be studied as a subsidiary (minor) subject, and it is closely linked with the Archaeology programme. The curriculum of Museum Studies is published at the beginning of each term and can be found on the Museum Studies programme's bulletin board and on its website. Information on possible information sessions is also posted on the bulletin board.

Museum Studies

The aim of the Museum Studies study package is to provide the students with information on the prospects of museum studies (museology). The teaching focuses on both theoretical and practical museology. The studies are composed of lectures, book exams, practical training and courses related to museum work. The programme studies museums, their functions as well as their sociocultural relations. It examines the past and describes and clarifies the processes of preserving, researching and communicating as part of human activity. Studies in museology aim to provide the students with a view of museum work and its goals, the history and presence of the museum as an institution, as well as the practical operation of museums. The Basic Studies package (25 ECTS credits) is commonly a prerequisite for jobs in Finnish museums. Therefore the Museum Studies programme enhances the student's prospects of employment.

Study package and learning outcomes

Upon completion of the Basic Studies package, students will be able to recognise central concepts of museum studies and the central fields in the operation of museums. In addition, students will be able to define the concepts of cultural and natural heritage, as well as recognise their significance in society. Students will also be able to define the position and functions of the museum as an institution and as a medium of cultural knowledge. Furthermore, students will be able to apply in practice the theoretical knowledge acquired in the Museum Studies programme.
