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Admission requirements

Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language is a subsidiary (minor) subject aimed at students studying the Finnish Language as their major or as a subsidiary subject and are native speakers of Finnish. Anyone wishing to commence studies in Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language must first have completed the Basic Studies package (25 ECTS credits) in the Finnish Language programme.

Study guidance

Study guidance is provided by the person responsible for the programme, Sisko Brunni.

Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language

The Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language programme offers a Basic Studies package (25 ECTS credits) as well as an Intermediate Studies package (35 ECTS credits). The studies are aimed at students who are interested in teaching Finnish as a second language in Finland or as a foreign language abroad and for students who will work with immigrants. The programme familiarises students with Finnish as a foreign language as well as gives the students the qualifications to teach the subject. The subject examines Finland as a multicultural country as well as Finnish study materials. The program also acquaints students with the characteristics of learner language and assessment of language proficiency as well as with teaching in practice.

Employment prospects

Students minoring in Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language typically have little trouble finding employment teaching Finnish to foreigners. The demand for S2 teaching has been steadily growing in Finland, also in northern Finland. In addition, Finnish is taught in approximately 100 universities abroad. Taking the programme as a subsidiary subject offers students of Finnish Language who aim to become teachers the possibility to teach Finnish as a second language as well, which can make finding employment easier.

Successful completion of the programme requires a fair amount of independent work. Studies include lectures and other contact teaching, various written assignments, working online, practice, and book exams. Every course in the programme is at least partly carried out online using the Optima online learning environment. All Basic Studies and Intermediate Studies can be completed as distance learning using this environment. Optima also functions as the primary channel of communication in the programme.

Basic-level courses are held every year and the Basic Studies package can be completed during one academic year. Intermediate-level courses are divided over two years and they are usually completed after the Basic-level courses.

Most of the Basic-level courses include a book exam, as well as lectures, practice or independent study. The exam can be completed on a Faculty of Humanities examination date. Students should sign up for the book exams on Faculty of Humanities examination dates via WebOodi at least 10 days prior to the examination day. Late sign-ups are not considered. Signing-up is not required for lecture examinations.

The studies include tutoring and work training, which may be completed via work placement which the students themselves secure in Finland or abroad during international student exchange, for example.

Students must enrol for studies in the Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language programme at the information session held at the beginning of each autumn term or by sending an email request to the person responsible for the programme. For individual courses, enrolment is done via WebOodi or the Optima environment if not otherwise instructed.

Students must ask the programme's person responsible to enter the overall grade for each study package in their official university student records.

Study packages and learning outcomes

Upon completion of the Basic Studies in Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language, students will be able to utilise basic concepts from the S2 field and display knowledge of students who study Finnish as a foreign language. Students will be able to explain the nature of the education provided for learners of Finnish on different levels. They will be able to describe how learners of Finnish should be guided in acquiring both linguistic and social knowledge and skills, and will be able to apply this information in practice. Students should also be able to recognise the differences in intercultural communication and be able to display knowledge of Finland as a multicultural society. Students should also be able to explain the basis of assessment of language proficiency and apply the knowledge in their teaching. After completing the Basic Studies, students will also have the skills needed to search for basic literature to support their research and teaching. Students will also be able to apply the information in practice.

Upon completion of the Intermediate Studies in Finnish as a Second and Foreign Language, students will be able to teach Finnish as a second and a foreign language. They will be able to conduct research and teach foreign students by applying theories of learning and teaching languages, and they will be able to analyse and assess models and conventions/methods of teaching. The students will be able to use various teaching methods and will be able to explain why matters are taught in a certain order. Students will also be able to apply and produce S2 teaching materials. After completing the Intermediate Studies, students will be able to describe the characteristics of learner language and interpret, analyse and apply research results in the S2 field as well as apply these results in their own research and teaching.
